HEAVENLY FRIENDS

Attach a Saint to each student's desk as you would a name tag. The teacher can give a brief overview of each Saint during the first weeks of school and send home an information sheet on the Saint to be shared for homework. Rotate the Saints monthly and repeat the process in order for the students to learn about different heavenly friends throughout the year. The Saints can also be used to call lines/groups, or pairing of students.



PRAYER CORNER:HOME-SCHOOL CONNECTION

Having a prayer corner in the classroom is just as, if not more, essential as the technology center, listening center, and/or other components that make up the day. Once you have introduced your students to the prayer corner in your classroom, a great beginning of the year activity is for the students to create their own "prayer corners" for home. Have students bring in a shoe box to decorate with religious pictures, stickers, etc. ... After the students have taken their projects home and set them up have them take a picture of their "prayer corner" at home and send it in. These pictures can be added to the class prayer corner. Having a special spot at school and at home helps the students to learn to center their lives in faith and focus on moments of prayer throughout the whole day (and weekends too!)

PAINTER'S STICKS

Materials: painter's stick, a pair of dice, 2
different color chips – 11 of each color

Using painter's sticks you can create an addition
activity for 2 students. Divide the stick into one
inch or one and a half inch spaces.
Number the spaces starting with
the number 2 ending with 12.



The students line their chips so that one chip is
under each number. Each takes a turn rolling
one dice. The student that rolls the largest
number begins the game.

The first student rolls the
dice and adds the two
numbers and gives the sum.



(Ex. $3+4=7$) That student then removes from his
partner's side the chip underneath 7. If the
student rolls a number that has already been
removed, the student simply loses his/her turn.
It is the next player's turn. The object of the
game is to remove all the chips from the other
player.
