
THE 130TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF MOTHER THERESA MAXIS, I.H.M. January 14, 1892

THE TRANSFER OF THE REMAINS OF MOTHER THERESA FROM WEST CHESTER TO IMMACULATA



During this month of January 2022, we will observe the 130th Anniversary of the death of Mother Theresa Maxis, who died on January 14, 1892. After a number of years away from the community, Mother Theresa eventually returned to her beloved IHM Congregation. Mother Gonzaga, our fourth Mother General, negotiated her return and brought her home to West Chester in 1885. Here in West Chester Mother Theresa spent seven happy years with her sisters until her death in 1892.

In this article, we offer a reflection on a truly historical and very sacred moment in the history of our IHM Congregation -- The Transfer of the Remains of Mother Theresa Maxis. Join us now in reflecting on the following historical records and photos.

Removal to Immaculata Cemetery, Immaculata, Pa. - July 31, 1965









Interment at Immaculata Cemetery, Immaculata, Pa. - August 2, 1965






May Mother Theresa Maxis continue to pray for us, her daughters in blue, as well as for all people throughout the world!
