As we plan for the re-purposing of our room, we see it evolving into a destination for multiple inspiring possibly and lifechanging activities such as reflection, prayer, learning, conversation, sharing and visioning that will enrich the life of each person who visits. This space is not intended to be a static museum of artifacts. We desire the room to breathe our living IHM legacy of grace. We want our IHM Heritage Room to animate our IHM spirit and mission and to motivate new expressions of how to bring to life our IHM graces of love, creative hope and fidelity as we continue to recognize and respond to the emerging needs of God's people. Since there is no elevator access to the top floor Archives, this will provide a much more inclusive opportunity to share and display our sacred history, as well as our treasured artifacts of both North and South America. We look forward to welcoming many more of our sisters, as well as other countless visitors. The original Archives will remain on the top floor.

Initial preparation of the room has involved such projects as: removing the drapes and sheers, additional tinting of the windows, stripping of the old and laying of the new carpet, extending our of WiFi and security capability, refinishing of the doors. replacing of two doors with panic- barred doors, lemon-oiling the paneling, and removing furniture not needed. The VMHS Maintenance Team, as well as several contractors, have professionally tended to these initial projects. Currently our IHM Heritage Room team is working with the Warfel Construction Company, as well as their sub-contractors, to design and finish the floor plan, furnishings, display areas, and technology capability.
