

The provided document compiles feedback from 29 small groups (Groups 1 through 33, excluding some numbers, plus a Local Community—Group 5) regarding how they can combine assets to amplify their charism in service to the Gospel.

The groups identified core assets as their members (Sisters and Associates), shared spirituality, prayer, and contemplative dialogue, educational and organizational expertise, and physical properties.

The proposed new possibilities and strategies for collaboration frequently centered on three main areas:

1. Leveraging Technology and Communication: Groups consistently suggested using technology to expand their reach and coordinate efforts. Possibilities included creating shared virtual prayer spaces or contemplative experiences, developing podcasts, videos, or social media initiatives to tell their story, and establishing shared online resources or blogs for communication and information exchange.

2. Strengthening Inter-Congregational Unity and Collaboration: Many groups emphasized the importance of fostering unity through shared projects and mutual support. Ideas included creating more opportunities for in-person meetings and relationship building, sharing personnel and expertise across congregations, and developing joint ministries, such as those modeled after the border ministry.

3. Focusing on Specific Mission Areas and Social Justice: The feedback highlighted several key mission areas for amplified efforts:

- **Immigration and Support for Marginalized Groups:** Groups proposed combining resources to assist immigrants (including legal aid, housing, and food) and working with the marginalized.
- **Anti-Racism and History:** Several groups stressed the need to address racism and creatively share the history of Mother Theresa Maxis and the OSP sisters, potentially through videos or programs.
- **Education and Formation:** Suggestions included collaborating on literacy centers, particularly online ESL instruction, sharing educational resources, and fostering intergenerational learning between Sisters and younger adults.
- **Environmental Efforts:** One group suggested combining ecological efforts following Laudate Si, specifically utilizing farmlands to grow food for the poor.

The groups also noted the importance of a "common voice" to address current societal needs and the potential for shared leadership and discernment in determining the future direction of their collaborative efforts.
