#### Haiti: Six Sisters Kidnapped

Six Sisters of the Sainte-Anne congregation together with an unknown number of laypeople and their driver were kidnapped on January 19, 2024, by armed men in Haiti. The kidnapping took place in broad daylight in the center of the capital Port-au-Prince. Haiti, the poorest country on the American continent, has been in a profound political crisis for years. Gang violence and political instability have led to many demonstrations on the streets of the capital. Demonstrators are calling for the resignation of Prime Minister Ariel Henry, who has been in power since the assassination of President Jovenel Moïse in 2021. After the Angelus on Sunday, Pope Francis appealed for the release of the sisters and peace in Haiti. He said: "I have learned with sorrow of the kidnapping, in Haiti, of a group of people, including six religious sisters: in my heartfelt plea for their release, I pray for social concord in the country, and I invite everyone to bring an end to the violence, which is causing a great deal of suffering to that dear population."
