Immigration

There has been so much conflicting information about the border recently, that I urge each Sister to take the time to view this webinar: Telling the Truth About the Border: A Humane Vision for Border Management. This webinar was produced by the Center for Migration Studies which is an arm of the USCCB. It features four panelists, beginning with Bishop Mark J. Seitz who heads the USCCB Committee on Migration and serves as the Bishop of El Paso, TX. The remaining panelists present a picture of their experience working with migrants and asylum seekers in Texas, Arizona, and San Diego. Each panelist addresses the involvement of the Catholic Church, the danger that politicizing the border has presented, and the possible, real solutions that could benefit both those seeking entry into our country and our country's economy as well. Faith-based organizations have been picking up the broken pieces of an immigration system for decades. The federal government, through FEMA, and local governments have collaborated to fund NGOs. Only recently have these faith-based organizations come under attack. Listen to Bishop Seitz's response to Governor Abbott and Attorney General Paxton's baseless claims in a lawsuit leveled against Annunciation House. Our Catholic Bishops have once again published the document, *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, (2015) with a new introduction. https://www.usccb.org/offices/justice-peace-human-development/forming-consciences-faithful-citizenship They have included six bulletin inserts that summarize the key points contained within the document. They are worth reading. While our Bishops once again declare the "threat of abortion as a preeminent priority" for choosing a candidate, they cast a larger net over issues that support Catholic Social Teaching upholding the life and dignity of the human person. These issues include euthanasia, gun violence, terrorism, the death penalty, human trafficking, a lack of justice for the poor, the suffering of migrants and refugees, wars and famines around the world, racism, the need for greater access to healthcare and education, care for our common home, and more. All threaten the dignity of the human person. They also tell us, "We must consider not only candidates' positions on these issues, but their character and integrity as well." That announcement is what seems to have sparked the latest explosion of violence which includes attacks on the central bank, the airport, and the national soccer stadium. The culmination of these events was the jailbreak at the National Penitentiary and another prison, released onto the streets of the capital more than 5,000 inmates. God help Haiti! Let us continue to pray for Haiti and her people.
