Pope Francis Opening Jubilee Year 2025

Jubilee 2025

The Holy Father has announced that 2025 will be a Jubilee Year. The theme for Jubilee 2025 is "Pilgrims of Hope." It will be a year of hope for a world suffering from the impact of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19, and the climate crisis. As a result of these conditions, developing countries have suffered, losing decades of progress, and incurring large financial debts. Pope Francis has declared the focus of this Jubilee Year to be debt forgiveness for impoverished nations. "A true 'ecological debt' exists," Pope Francis says since much of the environmental destruction in the world's poorest countries was caused by the world's wealthiest countries exploiting their natural resources and paying extraordinarily little for them.

<u>Update on Haiti: There is Some Good News from Haiti</u> Aid Delivery

The UN World Food Program (WFP) has delivered aid to Haiti.

- -15 tons of medical supplies to the Port-au-Prince airport
- -Rations to 93,000 people in the Cité-Soleil neighborhood.

Airport operations

Though flights remain limited, the Toussaint Louverture International Airport in Port-au-Prince has resumed operations.

Daily Life

Haitian towns are hives of informal activity, with small workshops, street markets, and food stalls providing thousands of day-to-day jobs.

United States and Haiti Trade

The United States facilitates bilateral trade with and investment in Haiti to combat poverty and tackle chronic unemployment. The large Haitian diaspora in the United States is a potentially powerful ally in the effort to expand business opportunities and build on the many links that unite Haitians and Americans.

Human Trafficking

January is dedicated to raising awareness about Human Trafficking. January 11th is National Human Trafficking Awareness Day and February 8th on the feast of Josephine Bakhita the Church recognizes the International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human Trafficking.
