We are living through a critical time in our country. There are sweeping changes our government is poised to deliver that will affect every aspect of American life except for the wealthiest among us. This is not a time to despair or be despondent. It is a time to stand on our faith and support the least among us, whose lives will be impacted the most.

Many have just participated in 3 days of virtual prayer hosted by LCWR (July 3-5) as a way of gathering, nationwide, to pray for our global community and the decisions being made by the United States.

On August 1, the feast of St. Alphonsus, we are invited to Pray, Fast, and Advocate as a part of LCWR's **100 Days of Prayer, Fasting, and Advocacy** to pray for our government officials and our nation. It is an opportunity for each of us to participate and, as a congregation, to unite in an action larger than ourselves.

On August 1, we are invited to:

- Pray in the way that resonates most deeply with our spirit.
- Fast from whatever keeps us from being Spirit-led and mission-focused.
- Advocate—both locally and at the state level for the systemic changes that align with God's dream for justice and compassion. (<u>LCWR Transformation Justice Resources</u> can assist with this.) Opportunities for advocacy will continue throughout the summer.

In solidarity with other congregations of religious men and women, we recognize that prayer, advocacy, and daily acts of compassion, while they may seem invisible and not immediately impactful, are extremely important.
