

Opening Prayer ~ Mary in the Easter Season

Appropriate for Board, Staff, and Faculty Meetings

Call to Prayer: St. Alphonsus, patron of the IHM Congregation, had a deep devotion and passionate love for Mary, the Mother of God. He believed that the graces and spiritual insights received throughout his life came to him through the hands of Mary.
